Three Teams from Byram Hills High School Compete in the National Academic Championship

Eleven students from Byram Hills High School traveled to the Washington, D.C. on May 31st to compete in the **National Academic Championship**. The National Academic Championship is a quiz bowl tournament that bring together teams from all over the United States and its territories. Students involved in the competition use Jeopardy style buzzers to be recognized and then answer questions on a wide range of subjects like math and geography.

This year Byram Hills was represented by two varsity teams. The varsity team consisting of Alan Chang, Josh Freedman, Lucas Travers and Moses Zhang qualified for the playoffs by winning their last two preliminary matches and ending up with a record of 4-2. Three sophomores, Luke Coviello, Bryan Lipton and Ryan Rosenblatt, also competed in the varsity division. Luke, Bryan and Ryan compiled a 3-3 record--an accomplishment for a young team that competed against teams made up of primarily juniors and seniors.

The JV team made up of Kathryn Lin, Sebastien Vasquez, John Ndocaj, and Leon Orlov-Sullivan finished up the preliminaries with a 5-1 record and the #1 seed for playoffs. This team advanced to the finals of the JV division where they lost a close match to a team from Charlottesville, Virginia.

BYRAM HILLS HS NEWS

The **Social Advocacy Club** serves as an umbrella club to several different programs each aimed at promoting a specific social issue through various community service organizations. Some outstanding highlights for the 2018-19 school year include:

The new **Learning Links** club was established by sophomores John D'Avanzo and Lily Deitelzweig. Club members voluntarily tutored ESL students in grades K-5 on a weekly basis through the Learning Links after school program at Mount Kisco Elementary School. Learning Links is part of the Neighbor's Link program whose mission is to strengthen the Mount Kisco community through the healthy integration of immigrants. In addition to academic support, the club organized and hosted a Christmas Celebration and Holiday Mercado for over 60 elementary school students after raising the necessary funds here at BHHS. In the spring, they partnered with Learning Links again for a Science Fair. The club seeks to increase BHHS students awareness and involvement within the Westchester community to serve as role models who empower young learners!

The **Growth in Awareness Group for Alzheimer's (GAGA)** raised \$45,000 for the 2018 Walk to End Alzheimer's at SUNY Purchase and was the top high school fundraising team in Westchester County for the 7th year in a row. Club presidents Hallie Remnitz and Tyler Greenfield also organized volunteer events at the Bristol Assisted Living Center in Armonk where students spent time with residents diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Students visited the center, made arts and crafts and played musical bingo with senior citizens. A great time was had by all!

The **Pleasantville Cottage School** club partnered with PCS which is home to emotionally troubled boys and girls ages 7-16. The club had over 30 BHHS students who volunteered at the school throughout the year. In the spring, they hosted a volunteer event where our students organized an Easter egg hunt, played basketball, held a kickball tournament, and did arts and crafts with Pleasantville Cottage School students. A delicious lunch and ice cream sundae bar was served by parent volunteers.

Another Learning Links group, led by Bryan Roden, spent several Friday afternoons at Mt. Kisco Elementary School leading soccer clinics with the Neighbor's Link children. The students loved being able to play soccer and other games with our students at the end of a long week. The clinics were so well attended that the BHHS club was able to partner with students at Horace Greeley who created their own chapter as well. The club plans to continue working with Horace Greeley students so that more teenagers in the area are able to participate in the soccer clinics.

Thank you to all the Social Advocacy students who volunteered their time, donated goods, and raised money- all with the intention of helping and spreading joy to others. !! Important Regents and Final Exam Information !!

- ☑ Regents exams and school final exams are required parts of the academic program and make up a part of the final course grade. Students who are seriously ill may make up a school final exam on the next day with a note from a doctor explaining their absence. Unfortunately, there are no make up dates for Regents Exams. Students may not be exempt from an exam or allowed to make up an exam due to summer plans. Further details can be found in the Academic Policy section of the Community Handbook.
- ☑ Please be aware that morning exams start at 8 AM and afternoon exams begin at noon, unless you are told alternate times due to approved testing modifications. Students should arrive 15 minutes before their exam.
- ☑ From June 18 to June 25 there will be no breakfast or lunch served in the cafeteria. Please make sure that students bring their own breakfast and lunch when there is more than one exam scheduled during the day. Bus schedules will run the same as a regular school day with the addition of a pickup at the high school at 11:30 following morning exams.

Summer Notice From The Nurse's Office

- Please have your soon-to-be 9th grader and 11th grader examined by a physician and provide the health office with a copy of this examination. NYS mandated that all 9th graders and all 11th graders have a copy of a physical exam in the nurse's office. This is a new mandate by NYS.
- Please have your physician complete medication administration forms and allergy action plans for use during the coming school year. All forms for medication need to be re-submitted for each new school year. The forms are located on the Byram Hills website under "Services", "Health Services", then "Forms and Reference Material", Medication Form.
- Please have your soon to be 12th grader vaccinated against the meningococcal virus this summer so they meet the new NYS mandate for 12 graders.

COURSE REGISTRATION FOR NEXT YEAR

Parents should have already seen a list of the courses that your child has requested for next year in e School Data (eSD). Please be aware that there are some cases where courses conflict and a student may not be able to take every course that they requested. Schedules will be available on the parent portal of eSD at the end of the summer, and the school counselors will be available the week before school opens to deal with any concerns or change of course requests.

Congratulations seniors on your upcoming graduation from Byram Hills High School. The School Counseling staff would like to wish you good luck in your post high school plans and look forward to hearing about your future successes.

Members of the junior class are reminded to return your profiles and any updated resumés to your counselor as soon as possible. Parents should complete the parent's information form and return it to their child's counselor. All BHHS college forms are available on the school website located at www.byramhills.org.

Juniors are also reminded that they should keep current with SAT and ACT test dates for June and early next year. Also, continue to research and visit colleges.

The counselors visited the sophomore classes to explain resumé building as part of the Sophomore Success Program. They will work with students during the next two years to expand the resume vis-à-vis additional activities and experiences.

MAKE THIS A PRODUCTIVE SUMMER

Some of the programs for high school students are housed on college campuses. Traditional summer schools for remediation (if a student fails a course) or for enrichment (if a student wishes to take a course for the first time) are offered at neighboring high schools. Students who choose to take these courses for advancement **must receive prior approval** from their counselor and the department chairperson in order to receive credit. Forms are available in the Counseling Center.

Summer is an ideal time to experience volunteer or paid work. Parents are in a position to help their children reach their goals and dreams. Encourage your child to compile a resumé that includes: name of schools attended, activities in and out of school (inclusive of both paid and voluntary employment), skills, abilities, leadership responsibilities and references.




"SHADOW DAY"

Over 17 of our teachers followed a variety of students through their daily schedules. Teachers physically "shadowed" students through all of their classes, lunch, free periods, and even during fire drills. This experience allowed the faculty and staff to have greater understanding of the daily life of our students. Teachers (and Principal Walsh) shared this experience with their colleagues at a faculty meeting. There was a unanimous vote for longer lunch!

2019-2020 School Year Immunization Requirement for Meningococcal Vaccine

Date: 5/2019

Dear Parent/Guardian,

All 7th, 8th, 9th, and 12th grade students MUST HAVE proof of having been given Meningococcal vaccine (shot) in order to attend school.

- Students entering **Grade 7, 8, 9 in 2019 must have 1 dose** of meningococcal vaccine. They will be required to get a booster at age 16.
- Students entering **Grade 12 in 2019 must have either:**
 - 2 doses of meningococcal vaccine with **the booster dose given on or after age 16**
 - 1 dose if your child's first dose was given on or after age 16

New York State law requires parents/ guardians to give the school an immunization (shot) record that shows their child has received, or has appointment(s) to receive the required vaccine(s) (shots) in order to attend school. This record may be from a health care provider, health department, or an official immunization record from the child's former school. The record must include:

1. Name of the vaccine
2. Date vaccine given
3. Who gave it, along with their title; or where it was given if at a clinic

Please contact your health care provider to make sure your child has what they need to attend school this fall.

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
