about the negative environmental impacts of fast fashion through the creation of a sustainable fashion magazine. Alexa's project was voted the overall winner of the featured projects.


Ashley Stangel, Do What's Write, will create an advocacy campaign to increase access to frequently banned books through the creation of a website and book fair.

All the students will present the results of their action plans at The Changemaker Project Showcase on June 2.


