The PSATs will be administered to all 11th graders on Wednesday, October 18th. All 11th graders should report to school before the start of Office Hours (7:45 AM). There will be a 3-hour delay for students in grades 9,10, and 12. Regular bus routes will run for the morning and for the 3-hour delay. Normal dismissal will take place on that day.

HALLOWEEN REMINDER

Halloween is on Tuesday, October 31st. Many students will choose to wear a costume on that day. With that in mind, we want to remind parents that students who choose to wear a costume must abide by some rules to ensure propriety and safety. Therefore, students will be required to cover or change from costumes that are in violation of the dress code. For safety and security reasons, we must also forbid students from wearing masks that conceal the face or from bringing in costume props that could be misused. The key is to remember that what might be appropriate for a party is not necessarily appropriate for school. While other high schools have found it necessary to "ban" Halloween, we hope that with your cooperation we can make it a fun and comfortable day for those who wish to participate, as well as those who don't.

A MESSAGE FROM THE STUDENT ASSISTANCE COUNSELOR

In our school community, Ms. Pagan wears many hats, including that of the Student Assistance Counselor and advisor for the inspiring Youth 2 Youth (Y2Y) Club. The Y2Y Club is a club that believes in the power of youth to influence their peers through positive peer pressure. Members of Y2Y pledge to be drug and alcohol free and work toward influencing their peers to do the same. Monthly activities are focused on raising awareness of the risks associated with drug and alcohol use and making healthy decisions.

September is National Recovery Month and members of Y2Y provided daily announcements, bulletin boards and a table activity during lunch to remind peers to celebrate people who are working to overcome struggles and obstacles in their lives.

Red Ribbon Week is scheduled for later this month and members of Y2Y will be providing information regarding this annual campaign. The Nationwide Red Ribbon Campaign was organized in response to the murder of Drug Enforcement Agent Enrique Camarena who was tortured and killed in Mexico in 1985. After his murder, communities across the nation began wearing red ribbons as a symbol of their commitment to raise awareness of the destruction caused by drugs in America. We wanted to introduce ourselves and remind you that we are available to all students. Please do not hesitate to contact us if we can be of any assistance.




Colleen Arini, M.A., NCSP, is a building-level school psychologist who works with students in grades 9-12th.
