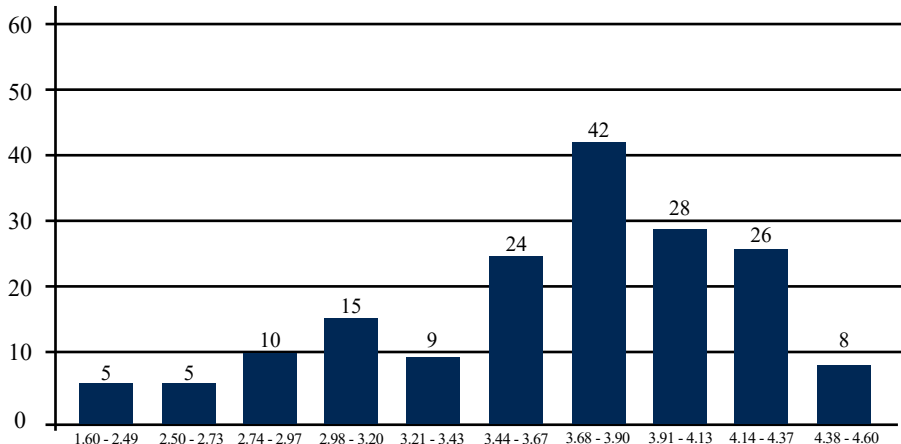

- Byram Hills High School offers college preparatory courses, Regents, Advanced, and AP classes.
- Courses are not weighted for GPA distribution.
- Byram Hills High School is on a semester system.
- Transcripts list cumulative year-end grades. Interim grades for seniors are sent to colleges in November and February.
- GPAs are calculated at the end of junior year.
- Summer school grades are reported on the transcript and included in the GPA. Grades for repeated courses are also shown on the transcript and included in the GPA. If a New York State Regents exam is retaken, only the highest score is reported. Failing grades remain on the transcript when the course is repeated.
- COVID-19 exemptions for Regents exams are indicated with the letter "E".

LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Teaching Assistant AP Computer Science A/AP Computer Science Principles	A selective leadership program for students who have taken and excelled in AP Computer Science A or AP Computer Science Principles. Selected students assist in lesson creation and delivery, provide programming assistance to students in the AP class, and (permitting) work on an independent project.
Teaching Assistant Chemistry Lab	A highly selective program for seniors who have taken AP Chemistry, or excelled in Chemistry A. Selected seniors receive training in instructional leadership, teach in our Regents chemistry classes, and act as laboratory assistants. The goal of the program is to provide high-achieving chemistry students with the opportunity to strengthen their knowledge in science, further their leadership skills, and offer support to peers who are enrolled in Regents chemistry. The Chemistry TAs facilitate regularly scheduled office hours to provide students with additional support.
Teaching Assistant In Arts Leadership	A highly selective program for high-achieving senior artists or musicians to serve as teaching assistants in entry-level classes, where they lead lessons, support beginners, assess learning, explore leadership, and offer additional help during office hours.
Big Brother/Big Sister	Seniors work in our Language and Communications Class alongside the teacher at least twice per week to support the development of key academic, vocational, and independent living skills, while also participating in regular seminars and completing reflective assignments.
Mentoring	A highly competitive program where seniors are selected and trained as mentors for ninth grade students during the first semester transition to high school. Mentors plan daily lessons and activities on orientation to the high school, personal development, community spirit, and citizenship while supervised by a faculty member.
Peer Leadership	Peer Leadership selected seniors are trained as instructional leaders and teach in our 10th grade health classes with a focus on healthy lifestyle choices.

SELECTIVE ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Global Scholars	Global Scholars is an interdisciplinary three-year course of study that develops students' global awareness, critical thinking, leadership, and cross-cultural communication skills as they investigate global issues, analyze diverse perspectives, and take informed action to address both local and global challenges.
Perspectives In Literature	Perspectives in Literature is an alternative for AP-qualified seniors, integrating literature, philosophy, art, and film through quarterly writing portfolios that contain creative, critical, and reflective writing.
Science Research	Authentic Science Research has a strong 36-year history of students participating in national competitions, including the International Science & Engineering Fair, the Junior Science & Humanities Symposium, and the Regeneron Science Talent Search. For the Class of 2025, the program celebrates one National 300 Scholar. From 1991 to 2024, the program has produced 136 National 300 Scholars and 22 National Finalists, reflecting the strength of its multidisciplinary approach.
Startup-Entrepreneurship	This entrepreneurship program immerses students in the real-world startup process as they design, develop, and pitch their own businesses with guidance from industry mentors, building skills in marketing, finance, and innovation while producing tangible deliverables.
Senior Explorations Internship	Senior internships are designed to enable seniors to apply their interests, knowledge and skills in a full-time work setting in business, the professions, government, the arts or volunteer service. Students will be full-day interns from mid-May through June. A faculty advisor helps students to select suitable internships.
