

CAPITAL COMPONENT SUMMARY


The capital component includes items related to:

- Planning, developing, and evaluating the K-12 curriculum














ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY








ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY








ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

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

The Board of Regents approved regulations establishing multiple, comparably rigorous assessment pathways to graduation for all students. These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.





Chapter 474 of the Laws of 1996 required a provision for the publication of superintendent and administrator salaries as part of the annual school district budget process. The essential points of the legislation are highlighted as follows:

- Salaries, benefits, and other in-kind compensation for all superintendents, associate or assistant superintendent, regardless of salary (this would also include deputy superintendents) must be appended to the proposed budget;
- Any other administrators or supervisors whose annual salary is in excess of \$162,000 must have their salary and position title appended to the budget document;
- These disclosures need only be appended to the proposed budget which is made available 14 days in advance of the vote and of which copies are available in each school building. There is no requirement to incorporate this information in any budget mailings, newsletters, or "popular" budgets.
