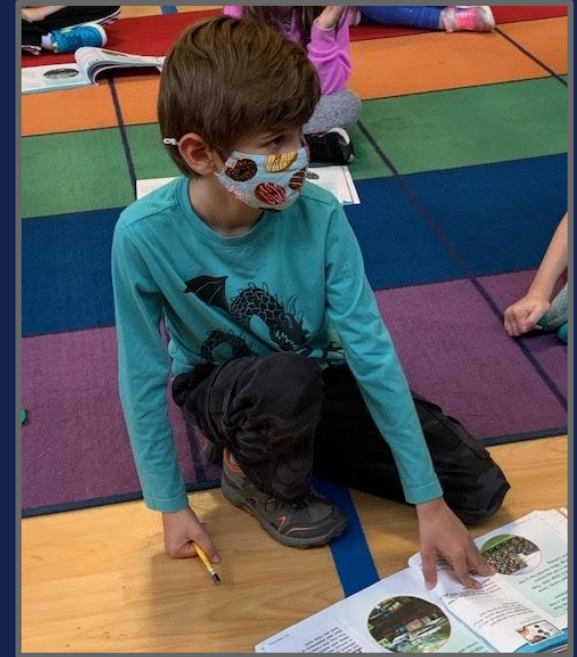

- Offering evidence-based summer, after school and other extended learning and enrichment programs.
- Supporting early childhood education.
- Fund programs that will continue beyond the availability of federal funding and the District will use local funds in order to minimize disruption to core academic and other school programs.

District Plan:

To address the impacts of COVID-19 pandemic on students:

- Grades K-5
 - Curriculum committees to develop scope and sequence in ELA, math, science and social studies; turnkey scope and sequence to all teachers.
 - Data team meetings to analyze diagnostic data and recommend strategies to advance learning in 2021-2022; plan assessment calendar for 2021-22.
- Grades 6-12
 - Curriculum teams with academic chairpersons to develop scope and sequence; turnkey scope and sequence to all teachers.
 - Data team analyze feedback from focus group interviews, Challenge Success survey and design challenge and recommend strategies for next year.

DISTRICT WIDE (20% allocation)

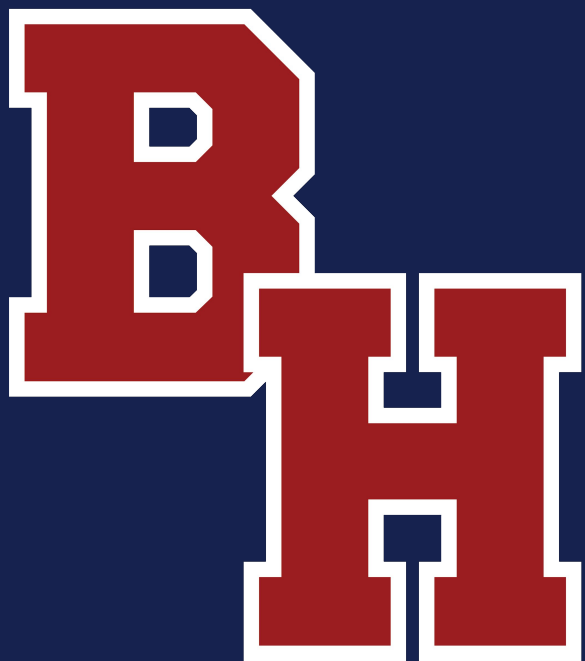
District Plan:

- Provide teacher training in evidence-based instruction to support student learning in ELA, math, science and social studies.

To offer evidence-based summer, after school and other extended learning and enrichment programs:

- Provide academic intervention services after school and during the summer.
- Develop enrichment opportunities for students during and after school.
