All students are expected to follow the Code of Conduct - Policy #5300:

Dress Code

As outlined in BOE policy 5300, student dress code shall be appropriate for school activities. Hats are not worn in school.

Smart Devices

We recognize that some students may have smart devices with the intent to use after school hours. Students with these devices (cell phones, smart watches, Gizmos, etc) are not permitted to use them during school hours (including time on the bus). If a student uses it to access the internet, send or receive text messages, the student will be asked to put it in their backpack. If a student continues to use it, the device will be given to the office and parents will be called to pick it up. If your child has a device, we recommend using parent controls to shut the device down during school hours.

Kindles and other smart readers may be used as reading devices as long as the Internet connection is disabled and books are preloaded.

If a parent needs to contact their child, they should call the school or email their child's teacher.

Violations of Code of Conduct

If a student is in violation of the Code of Conduct, the student will have an opportunity to discuss the violation and learn from the experience. Consequences will be determined based on:

- 1. The student's age and grade.
- 2. The situation where the problem took place.
- 3. Previous violations of the Code of Conduct
- 4. Information from teachers, support staff, and parents.
