## **ESSA-Funded Programs**

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), which is the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and Race to the Top (RTTT), is the nation's main education law for public schools. It is designed to provide equal opportunity for all students to achieve at high levels.

ESSA includes a wide array of programs that provide schools and districts with resources focused on meeting the needs of students, parents and families, teachers, and school leaders. Byram Hills receives funding from ESSA, designed to support the achievement of disadvantaged students. Each year, the District holds meetings to explain ESSA-funded programs (during principals' coffees) and shows the many ways that parents can be involved in our schools.
